FENTANYL (SUBLIMAZE)

Drug Classification: Narcotic analgesic

BACKGROUND

Pharmacodynamics

This medication is a potent synthetic narcotic agonist analgesic with pharmacologic actions qualitatively similar to those of morphine but whose action is quicker and less prolonged. Onset of 1 minute for IV/IO and 7 to 8 minutes for IM. Duration of 30 to 60 minutes for IV/IO and 1 to 2 hours for IM administration.

Indications

• Pain management, especially of traumatic orthopedic, post-intubation, or suspected cardiac origins.

Contraindications

- Allergy or known hypersensitivity to the medication.
- Hypotension (systolic BP < 90 mmHg in adults).

Cautions

- Use with caution in patients with asthma, COPD, hepatic or renal disease or bradyarrythmias.
- Be prepared to assist ventilations and to administer the narcotic antagonist naloxone (Narcan) if respiratory depression or hypotension occurs.
- May cause skeletal and/or thoracic muscle rigidity if given rapidly.

DOSAGE and ADMINISTRATION

ADULT	PEDIATRICS (less than 60 kg)
For acute traumatic orthopedic pain or chest discomfort suspicious for acute coronary syndrome ¹	 For acute traumatic AND non-traumatic pain 1. Administer 2 mcg/kg IV slowly, titrated to effect.
 For pain rated at <7: Administer initial dose of 1 mcg/kg IV slowly, titrated to effect. 	OR
For pain rated at >7: Administer initial dose of 2 mcg/kg IV slowly IN 100mcg increments, titrated to effect.	Administer 2 mcg/kg IN, injecting one half the dose in each nostril using 7U Mucosal Atomization Device .
OR	OR
For all pain scores: Administer 2 mcg/kg IN,	Administer 2 mcg/kg IM.
injecting one half the dose in each nostril using 7U Mucosal Atomization Device .	 Contact Medical Control for doses exceeding 2 mcg/kg.

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	ADULT	PEDIATRICS (less than 60 kg)
2.	Repeat doses at 0.5 mcg/kg IV/IN/IM every 10-15 minutes to a maximum total dose of 400 mcg.	
3.	Contact Medical Control for doses exceeding 400 mcg.	

ADVERSE REACTIONS/SIDE EFFECTS

• Nausea, vomiting, dizziness, syncope, respiratory depression, apnea, or sedation, hypotension

NOTES

¹For patients over the age of 65, use half of the typical adult dosage.
