## **MIDAZOLAM (VERSED)**

**Drug Classification: Benzodiazepine** 

#### **BACKGROUND**

#### **Pharmacodynamics**

This medication is a short-acting benzodiazepine with CNS depressant, muscle relaxant, anticonvulsant, and anterograde amnestic effects. Versed has no analgesic effect. Onset is 3 to 5 minutes with duration of about 2 hours.

#### **Indications**

- Deep procedural sedation prior to external pacing and cardioversion.
- Continued sedation after ROSC or post DFAM.

#### **Contraindications**

- Allergy or known hypersensitivity to the medication or other benzodiazepines.
- Systolic blood pressure < 90.

#### **Cautions**

- May cause mental, respiratory, and cardiovascular depression. Be prepared to provide respiratory and circulatory support.
- Use with caution when used concomitantly with barbiturates, narcotics, and/or any other CNS depressants.

## **DOSAGE and ADMINISTRATION**

	ADULT	PEDIATRICS (less than 60 kg)
1.	Administer 5 mg IV/IO over 2 minutes and titrated to effect. May repeat every 5-10 minutes as needed.	Administer 0.1 mg/kg (max of 5 mg) IV/IO over 2 minutes and titrated to effect. May repeat every 5-10 minutes as needed.

	When vascular access is not available or not likely, administer 10 mg IN. This route may require up to 5 minutes to take effect.	When vascular access is not available or not likely, administer 0.2 mg/kg IN. <sup>1</sup> This route may require up to 5 minutes to take effect.

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# **ADVERSE REACTIONS/SIDE EFFECTS**

- Retrograde amnesia
- Paradoxical behavior or excitement
- Headache, hypotension, nausea, vomiting

## **NOTES**

<sup>1</sup> Due to the small volume required for the pediatric patient, when administering this medication IN draw the medication into a syringe and add 1 ml normal saline.
