# LORAZEPAM (ATIVAN)

**Drug Classification: Benzodiazepine** 

#### **BACKGROUND**

#### **Pharmacodynamics**

This medication has anxiolytic, sedative, hypnotic, amnesic and skeletal muscle relaxant effects. It suppresses the spread of seizure activity through the motor cortex of the brain while maintaining the abnormal discharge focus. Lorazepam has an onset of 1 to 5 minutes IV and 15 to 30 minutes IM. Peak effects occur in 15 to 20 minutes IV and 2 hours IM. Its duration of action is 6 to 8 hours.

#### **Indications**

- Anxiety/agitation
- Seizures

## **Contraindications**

• Allergy or known sensitivity to benzodiazepines

#### **Cautions**

This medication should be protected from excessive heat and should be inspected closely
prior to administration. If any discoloration or the presence of a precipitate is noticed,
the drug should not be used.

### **DOSAGE and ADMINISTRATION**

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ADULT	PEDIATRICS (less than 60 kg)
For active seizure  1. Administer 1 to 2 mg IV/IO/IM/IN every 5 minutes to a maximum total dose of 6 mg.	3. Be prepared to support ventilations.  For active seizure  1. Administer 0.1 mg/kg (max single dose of 2 mg) IV/IO/IM/IN every 5 minutes to a maximum total dose of 6 mg.

# **ADVERSE REACTIONS/SIDE EFFECTS**

• Amnesia, drowsiness, confusion, hypertension or hypotension, nausea and vomiting

#### **NOTES**

- <sup>1</sup> The preferred intravenous method of delivery for this medication is through a flowing fluid line. It should be delivered no faster than 2 mg per minute. **However, the initial dose should be given IN for the seizing patient**.
- <sup>2</sup> Administration of this medication via IV/IO with only a saline lock is the least preferred route. If this method is to be used, the medication must be diluted. To dilute, expel the air in the carpuject and draw up an equal amount of normal saline. Rock the solution to mix. <u>Do not shake</u>. Then, administer slowly at no more than 2 mg per minute.
