#### 2020 Budget

Chief Juelfs requested one change, to the approved draft budget. The health insurance costs came in \$35,000 under the budget amount and he is requesting that the Board reallocate that savings to provide mental health training and checkups. Chief Juelfs would like to designate \$20,000 to provide mental health checkups to all personnel and provide additional mental health training. The remaining \$15,000 would be allocated to cover the cost of overtime. The Board realizes the importance of mental health and approves of this request.

Motion was made to approve the 2020 budget by Berry; seconded by Flatley. Motion carried.

Motion was made to accept the proceeds for the EMS Tax Levy to be used for Emergency Medical Service by Flatley; Seconded by Berry.

Motion carried.

Motion to hold closed meeting pursuant to Minn. Stat. 13D.03 to conduct the performance evaluation of Fire Chief Juelfs at 5:15 pm by Wippermann; seconded by Berry.

Motion carried.

Motion to re-open meeting at 5:30 pm by Flatley; seconded by Berry.

Board President Napier stated that Chief Juelfs employment agreement, with South Metro Fire, states that he will be at the top of the pay range by 2023. After reviewing all evaluations that were turned in, the Board feels that Chief Juelfs shall be placed at the top of the range as of January 1, 2020.

Motion was made to increase Chief Juelfs salary, including the 3% 2020 COLA, to the 2019 top scale of \$131,634 by Wippermann; seconded by Berry. Motion carried.

#### **Summary:**

Working with Marsh & McLennan Agency (MMA) representatives, we received the renewal rates for our property, casualty, and HealthEast excess liability coverage policies from the LMCIT.

The 2020 renewal premiums for property and casualty coverage increased by 6.6% or \$1,081, as compared to the 2019 rates. The premium renewal costs for the excess liability coverage, as required by our contract with HealthEast, increased by 5.5% or \$899 as compared to the 2019 rate.

#### **Budget Impact:**

Overall, the premium renewal costs for 2020 are within the budgeted amount.

#### **Summary:**

Again for 2020 we have the opportunity to apply for State Fire Aid. This aid is to help subsidize pension costs for local governments and fire departments. There are numerous factors involved to determine the amount of aid received, including our service areas. After reviewing the application form, there appear to be no changes for SMFD and our application will be similar to our 2019 submission.

#### **Budget Impact:**

The actual amount received can change annually due to changes in revenues received at the State and/or legislative action. Based on the fluctuation of this revenue source over the last several years, it is difficult to accurately project this revenue amount from year to year. The amount of the State Fire Aid payable in 2020 will not be determined until late September, and then paid in early October. The actual amount for 2019 Fire Aid was \$178,187.72 or 7% more than projected. The projected 2019 budget amount is \$166,624.

#### **Recommendation:**

Authorize the SMF Board Secretary and the Fire Chief to sign and submit appropriate documents.
